

Red Hot Irons Ltd Privacy Policy

About this document

This privacy notice explains how Red Hot Irons Ltd ("we", "our", "us") collects, uses and shares your personal data, and your rights in relation to the personal data we hold. This privacy notice concerns our processing of personal data of members, those registering for and attending events and anyone else with an interest in endometriosis who interacts with the us (together, "you", "your").

Red Hot Irons Ltd (a limited company, number SC225660), which is registered with the Information Commissioner's Office with registration number ZA355996) is the data controller of your personal data and is subject to the Data Protection Act 1998 ("DPA") (and, once in force, the General Data Protection Regulation (the "GDPR") as well as future legislative changes ("data protection legislation").

How we collect your information

We may collect your personal data in a number of ways, for example:

- From the information you provide to us when you register for the events or opt in to receive information from a client organisation
- When you communicate with us by telephone, email or via our website, for example to make enquiries about Red Hot Irons Ltd services
- In various other ways as you interact with us for the purposes set out below

The types of information we collect

We may collect the following types of personal data about you:

contact and communications information, including:

- your contact details (including email address(es), telephone numbers and postal address(es);
- your communication preferences;
- records of communications and interactions we have had with you;
- your name, title,
- your image and likeness including as captured in photographs;
- information you have publicly shared on social media;
- information concerning your engagement with us, including attendance client events managed by us;
- your internet protocol or IP address;
- dietary requirements and other special needs relevant to attendance at events or services purchased or requested from us (e.g. large print, levelled access).

financial information, including:

- bank account number, name and sort code (used for processing Direct Debits payment for events, payment of fees or donations);
- details of financial transactions, for example event payments.

The basis for processing your information and how we use it

We may process your personal data because it is necessary for the performance of event registration or other contract with you or in order to take steps at your request prior to entering into a contract. In this respect, we use your personal data for the following:



- to interact with you before or after you register for an event for example, to answer any questions you have;
- to deal with any concerns or feedback you may have;
- for any other purpose for which you provide us with your personal data.

We may also process your personal data because it is necessary for our, or a third party's **legitimate interests**. Our "legitimate interests" include our client's charitable objectives. In this respect, we may use your personal data for the following:

- to monitor and evaluate the performance and effectiveness of our activities;
- to keep you informed (by letter, telephone, email and other electronic means) of news and information about our events, activities and details of opportunities to get further involved with client organisations in accordance with your communication preferences and subject to having your consent for being contacted by email;
- to ensure that our communications are relevant to you and your interests;
- administrative purposes, for example in connection with an event you have registered for or attended:
- internal record-keeping, including the management of any feedback or complaints.

We may also process your personal data for our compliance with our **legal obligations**. In this respect, we may use your personal data for the following:

- to meet our compliance and regulatory obligations, such as compliance with anti-money laundering laws and tax reporting requirements;
- for the prevention and detection of crime;
- in order to assist with investigations (including criminal investigations) carried out by the police and other competent authorities.

We may also process your personal data where:

- it is necessary to protect your or another person's vital interests;
- it is necessary for the establishment, exercise or defense of legal claims (for example, to protect and defend our rights or property, and/or the rights or property of our members);
- we have your specific or, where necessary, explicit consent to do so.

In particular, with your consent, we may process your personal data to provide you with information about our events, activities and details of opportunities to get further involved with client organisations, for example, by sending you emails. If you do not wish to receive such information, you can withdraw your consent to these types of emails using the links in the email message or by contacting heatheroliver@redhotirons.com

Sharing your information with others

For the purposes referred to in this privacy notice and relying on the bases for processing as set out above, we may share your personal data with certain third parties. We may disclose limited personal data to a variety of recipients including:

- our employees, agents and contractors where there is a legitimate reason for their receiving the information, including third parties where we have engaged them to process data on our behalf as part of administering events;
- internal and external auditors;
- when Red Hot Irons Ltd is legally required to do so (by a court, government body, law enforcement agency or other authority of competent jurisdiction), for example by the Charity Commission.

We do not sell your personal data to other organisations.



International data transfers

As a matter of course, we do not transfer your personal data outside of the European Economic Area. We may, however, transfer your personal data around the world on an *ad hoc* basis, for example where this is necessary for interaction with you, and you are located outside of the EEA. In such circumstances, we will consider whether any additional measures are required in order to give adequate protection for the information when it is transferred outside of the EEA.

How long your information is kept

Red Hot Irons Ltd has a data retention policy and disposal schedule which determines how long data will be held. A copy of our data retention policy and disposal schedule is available from heatheroliver@redhotirons.com.

Your rights

Under data protection legislation you have the following rights:

- to obtain access to, and copies of, the personal data that we hold about you;
- to require that we cease processing your personal data if the processing is causing you damage or distress;
- · to require us not to send you marketing communications;
- to require us to correct the personal data we hold about you if it is incorrect;
- to require us to erase your personal data;
- to require us to restrict our data processing activities (and, where our processing is based on your consent, you may withdraw that consent, without affecting the lawfulness of our processing based on consent before its withdrawal);
- to receive from us the personal data we hold about you which you have provided to us, in a reasonable format specified by you, including for the purpose of you transmitting that personal data to another data controller;
- to object, on grounds relating to your particular situation, to any of our particular processing activities where you feel this has a disproportionate impact on your rights.

Please note that the above rights are not absolute, and we may be entitled to refuse requests where exceptions apply, such as, where we are required by law to hold specific data.

If you have given your consent and you wish to withdraw it, please contact heatheroliver@redhotirons.com. Please note that where our processing of your personal data relies on your consent and where you then withdraw that consent, we may not be able to provide all or some aspects of our services to you and/or it may affect the provision of those services.
